

# **AVRR from Morocco:**

Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration

# Why an Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) programme?

The AVRR programme aims to assist vulnerable or at-risk migrants who wish to return voluntarily to their country of origin but are unable to do so by their own, by providing them with an alternative solution for a sustainable return and reintegration carried out in a safe and dignified way and tailored to their needs.

#### Who can benefit from this assistance?

The AVRR programme primarily targets stranded, vulnerable and at-risk migrants who are willing to return voluntarily to their country of origin but who lack the financial or legal resources to do so.

#### Areas of intervention:

### Direct assistance to migrants:

Through facilitating the voluntary return and socioeconomic reintegration in the country of origin, as well as monitoring and referral of vulnerable cases to the relevant structures.

#### **Development:**

This programme contributes to development by empowering migrants/returnees and encouraging personal, professional and local development.

#### • Global AVRR Data:

- More than **1,3 million** migrants benefitted from AVRR since 1979
- More than **400,000** migrants have been assisted over the past decade
- On average, between **25,000** and **30,000** migrants return every year through IOM AVRR programmes
- Key figures from the AVRR programme in Morocco:
- Since 2005, IOM Morocco has assisted more than **6800** beneficiaries to 36 different countries
- Regarding returns to Morocco, more than **900** returnees have been assisted since 2007.

#### **Objectives:**

- Safeguarding dignity and rights of migrants in operating returns, while seeking adherence to applicable international principles and standards;
- Preserving the integrity of regular migration structures and asylum procedures;
- Enhancing dialogue and cooperation between origin, transit and host countries involved in the return process and reinforcing the responsibility of countries of origin towards their returning nationals;
- Addressing, to the extent possible, the root causes of irregular migration;
- Advocating for the adoption of comprehensive approaches towards voluntary return, including post-return reintegration assistance; and
- Working with national and international partners in both host country and country of origin, to promote international dialogue and implement capacity-building for AVRR initiatives.

#### Added value:

This programme is particularly crucial in the Moroccan context as it allows to manage migration flows in a humane manner while at the same putting emphasis on development aspects. IOM works closely with a multitude of stakeholders: governments, international organizations, civil society and local communities.

# Steps of the voluntary return procedures:



1. First contact: Migrants directly contact IOM Morocco to express his/her interest to benefit from the AVRR Programme.

2. Interview: IOM Morocco sets an appointment to conduct an in-depth interview to assess the specific situation of the migrant.





- 3. Medical visit: Prior to departure each beneficiary receives a medical health check to ensure that he/she is fit for travel.
- 4. Laissez-passer: For beneficiaries who do not have a passport, IOM facilitates liaison with embassies so they can obtain a laissez-passer (travel document).





- **5. Departure:** Once all the previous steps have been completed, IOM sets a return date, prepares all departure arrangements for the beneficiary and informs the IOM Office in the country of origin of the forthcoming return.
- **Pre-departure training:** In preparation for the return and reintegration process, IOM collaborates with different partners to offer trainings on soft skills (communication, self-esteem, etc.), health related aspects and/

or professional development (entrepreneurship, income-generating activities, microfinance, etc.).

# Steps of the reintegration assistance procedure:

1. Contact: Upon return, the beneficiary contacts the person in charge of reintegration at the IOM Office in the country of origin.





- 2. Guidance and counseling: With the advice and guidance of the IOM office, the returnee sets his socio-professional objectives regarding his/her reintegration activity.
- 3. Monitoring with the returnee and the service provider: For the returnees willing to start a micro project, IOM assists them with all the payment procedures and costs related to an activities within the limit of the amount that has been allocated.





- 4. Other types of assistance: The reintegration assistance can also be used to cover vocational training, medical, accommodation costs as well as tuition fees for children.
- 5. Monitoring of the reintegration activity: IOM ensures a professional and psychosocial monitoring by telephone and, if possible, through field monitoring visits for each beneficiary in order to learn about the socio-economic conditions of the communities of return as well as and the different factors that lead to a successful reintegration.



IOM assists and accompanies each migrant up to the airport on the return date. The migrant can, at all times, even at the airport, decide to interrupt his/her return movement.
